Collectors include, James Garner, Neil Simon, Toyota Corporation, UCLA Dental and Law School, the US Air Force, UCSF Dental School and many more. Nelson has won over 200 awards of excellence and

Corrigan Gallery LLC in Charleston, SC, will present *Interiors – The Light Within*, featuring works by Lese Corrigan, on view from Oct. 3 through Nov. 1, 2014. A reception will be held on Oct. 3, from 5-8pm.

The exhibition *Interior – The Light Within* is made up of oil paintings of interiors in one form or another. Simple interiors, simply interiors or is there something else that is depicted or referenced in these works? Interior is defined as "inside, inner, middle, within, within any limits, enclosure or substance." One can also define the word as "pertaining to the immediate contents of consciousness; relating to that which one can perceive within one's self; inward; inmost; mental." Sounds like more than a room can certainly be involved with interiors

Light - white, lux, beautiful, to fill with brightness, radiant energy, shines, clear, light in weight – all these are wonderful inspiring concepts for the favorite buzz word artists use to describe what they paint. Does it have a simplicity or is it the complexity that creates life as we know it? Are we looking inward or are we on the inside? Is the thoughtfulness of placement in a home comforting or inspiring? Do the objects hold the light? Can we uncover the light within things? Do these questions matter?

Painting interiors has a long history - think Vermeer. The artists of the late 19th century such as Bonnard and Matisse took it to another level. This tradition continues in the work of many contemporaries. Documenting a sense of style and of the time, the simple interior is a carrier of information. A play on the sense of interior, can take the subject to the level of psychology, philosophy or spirituality. Perhaps, just a simple, pretty picture is established by the creator of the interior.

In its tenth year, Corrigan Gallery is the culmination of 27 years of experience in the Charleston art market. Representing more than a dozen artists in an intimate space, the

gallery presents a new show almost every month and invites visiting artists to join in.
