

Ackland Art Museum in Chapel Hill, NC, is presenting Flash of Light, Fog of War: Japanese Military Prints, 1894 1905, which spotlights dramatic Japanese prints in an innovative installation, on view through Jan. 7, 2018. Flash of Light, Fog of War: Japanese Military Prints, 1894-1905, is an expansive exhibition showcasing 75 Japanese prints of battle scenes from the First Sino-Japanese War and the Russo-Japanese War at the turn of the 20th century. The Louise Wells Cameron Art Museum in Wilmington, NC, is presenting Created by Light, an exhibit exploring the photography collections of nine North Carolina art museums, on view through Feb. 11, 2018. The exhibition will showcase over 100

photographs highlighting both the pioneers of the medium and contemporary artists working in the field today. CAM invited eight North Carolina art museums to participate in this collaborative exhibition, asking each to curate which photographs to feature from their permanent collections. One museum focused on Bauhaus works created between the world wars, another curated a body of work by North Carolina photographers, while others chose work by such well-known artists as Robert Mapplethorpe, Andres Serrano, Mickalene Thomas, Burk Uzzle, Edward Weston, Aaron Siskind, Francesca Woodman and Ansel Adams.
